University Policy

University Policy designates that all University employees, students, volunteers, and Authorized Adults must also report violations of University policy or state and/or federal law to the Office of Equal Opportunity (in addition to reports made to state agencies)

Utah State Law

The state of Utah designates a Mandatory Reporter as any person who has reason to believe that a child has been subjected to abuse or neglect (Utah Code Ann. 62A-4a-403)
